HERMOSA BEACH MURALS PROJECT “WALK IN HISTORY 1900-1919” – June 5, 2010

The Hermosa Beach Murals Project is excited to host its first “Walk in History 1900 - 1919” on Saturday, June 5, 2010. Groups will start their tour on Pier Plaza and The Strand in Hermosa Beach at 10am (recommended for kids) and 11:30am. This walking tour will explore the history of Hermosa Beach through the viewing of significant historical sites over a 1 mile course.

This will be a wonderful educational experience for both kids and adults. Each “Walking Tour Participant” will also receive a souvenir badge and have the opportunity to win gifts and prizes and paint a Mural of their own. There will also be commemorative t-shirts for sale – to benefit the Hermosa Beach Murals Project.
